# A wonderful city of Monozkuri


One of the leading manufacturing areas in Japan, which is full of a wide variety of products made by lots of small and medium enterprises (SMEs) with high technology.

Higashiosaka is known as a city of the manufacturing industry. It has one of the highest numbers and densities of manufacturers in Japan. Additionally, SMEs with fewer than 20 employees on their payroll account for approximately 90 percent of the manufacturers in this city. The products, which are created in small factories with reliable skills, play important roles in the country and the world.

## We are proud of the products made in Higashiosaka.

Higashiosaka is nationally famous for Monozkuri. In this city, there are many manufacturers, which are small in scale but have a challenging spirit and passion. The partnerships among such manufacturers create the capability to produce everything from toothbrushes to artificial satellites supporting people's lives in the world. I hope that this booklet explains the attractiveness and social roles of the manufacturing industry and helps you understand the current situation of the manufacturing industry in Higashiosaka, which we are proud of.




## The number of manufacturers in Higashiosaka is the fifth highest in Japan.

The number of manufacturers is 5,564, which is the fifth highest in Japan and the highest with the government-designated cities being excluded. This proves that Higashiosaka is one of Japan's leading cities of the manufacturing industry.

The numbers of manufacturers by major city in Japan (based on the economic census activity survey of 2021)






## Factories close to people in Higashiosaka

The density of manufacturers in Higashiosaka is 107.6 per square kilometer, which is the highest in Japan. This environment makes citizens feel familiar with the manufacturing industry.

## One out of four employees is engaged in the manufacturing industry.

The city's employees engaged in the manufacturing industry account for 25.5%, which is the highest in Japan, showing that not only the number of manufacturers but also that of their employees are high. Those who are engaged in the manufacturing industry are supporting Higashiosaka.

## **Casting** industry

Kawachi casting is said to be the roots of the casting industry in Japan. (Kawachi is the eastern part of Osaka prefecture) The traditional technique known as Kawachi casting was introduced to Higashiosaka.



## Monozkuri in the Yayoi period (300 BCE to 300 CE)!?

Higashiosaka has an abundance of remains. Casting molds, bronze bell-shaped vessels, bronze swords, and bracelets were excavated from the remains of the Yayoi period, which shows they had engaged in casting from time immemorial.



A casting mold for bronze bell-shaped vessel excavated from the remains of Kitoragawa The production of iron kettles, as well as pots and pans, became widely popular.

Wiredrawing industry

The water wheel industry utilizing the rapid stream from Mt. Ikomay ama encouraged the manufacture of coloring powders and drug powders.

Merchants in Higashiosaka started to manually draw wires with the order for the copper wires used to make Japanese hair sticks in Kyoto. Wire drawing was performed using a water wheel as a source of power for the first time. In addition, the wiredrawing industry became prosperous in the Hiraoka area, eastern part of the city.

After multipurpose iron wires were introduced, the domestic production of nails and other iron related products has started as well.

Cotton textile industry

Rerouting and Reclamation of the river running through Higashiosaka, gave people the vast land for Kawachi cotton production.

Kawachi cotton textiles were distributed widely.

The imports of foreign-grown cotton gradually increased.

With the abolishment of tariffs on imported cotton in 1896, Japan's cotton agriculture declined rapidly, leading to unemployment and job-changing.



The heroine, who develops bonds with various people while struggling as a sales representative at a screw factory before starting a company that connects local factories, truly symbolizes the characteristics of Higashiosaka, a Monozkuri City.









Helmets and resources recycling

Helmets made from new materials, compound of waste scallop shells and plastics.

I strongly believe that creating new materials out of waste is a key solution to environmental problems.

We manufacture plastic products including parts used for devices in hospitals and offices. Although we often manufacture products based on drawings provided by our clients, in recent years we have been focusing on developing our original products as well. Coming from an engineering background, I had always wanted to "give shape to my ideas," but when a product I developed during the COVID-19 pandemic was adopted in educational area, I became aware of the need to develop products that could contribute to society.

In the meanwhile, I learned that the large amount of discarded shells generated during the processing of scallops is a social issue in Hokkaido. In order to solve this situation, we developed an environmentally friendly helmet made of eco-plastic material, which is a compound of waste shells and plastics.

It was an experienced employee with extensive knowledge of plastics who came up with the idea of utilizing seashells as a material. This idea was born from the know-how accumulated within the company and the ideas of younger employees. We would like to positively change the impression of reuse of waste by utilizing our eco-plastics manufacturing technology.





## To be a comfortable city for both citizens and manufactures.

Higashiosaka City is a vibrant city with a cluster of a wide variety of manufacturing business.

Our daily lives and manufacturing industry in the city are supported by their technological capabilities.


